Cohort 23: End-of-Service Training

August welcomed a new volunteer cohort getting placed in the community, as well as the completion of service for cohort 23. Following their one year volunteer service in the community, Youth Star volunteer cohort 23 was invited to attend three-day end of service training at Youth Star office from August 7 to 9, 2017.

The key purpose of this training is to enhance volunteer employability through mindful reflection of their experience, alongside employability skills development. The first day of the training was a reflection day where the volunteers were asked to draw their ‘river of life’ reflecting their challenges, solutions, and achievements during their placement. Later in the afternoon session, Youth Star Cambodia welcomed trainers from National Employment Agency (NEA) who trained our volunteers on soft skills and job opportunities.

On the second day cohort 23 linked their experiences to transferable skills: in this session, they were taught how to match and transfer the knowledge and skills they have gained with job competencies.

On the final day, we were pleased to welcome external trainers from HRInc. Cambodia and BDLiNK. They provided the technical skills on professional CV and cover letter writing skills. Additionally, they also gave out tips for interview

preparation. Following this, our volunteers were offered the chance to put theory into practice; writing CV and cover letter, and conducting an interview role-play and feedback session.

To celebrate their successful completion of one year service the Youth Star team prepared them a small party and special certificates acknowledging their unique personal development. To this end, Youth Star Cambodia would like to take this chance to thank them for their hard works and strong commitment to make changes in the community they served. Additionally, we wish them a bright future in their career.
