## HAPPY 15TH ANNIVERSARY OF YOUTH STAR CAMBODIA

September 2020 marks the 15th year since the beginning of Youth Star Cambodia that was initiated by Ms. Eva Mysliwiec in 2005.

Fifteen years ago, Eva felt strongly that Cambodia's young people could be a powerful resource for addressing their country's most pressing social issues and for contributing to the development of the country. Alongside this, Youth Star has become a place to build human resources, capacity and leadership, developing young Cambodians to fulfill professional careers.

#### The Story of Change of Phat Sat

Phat Sat is a 12-year-old boy living in Koh Samrong village, Por Pork commune, Staung district, Kampong Thom province. Born into a poor family of three children, Phat Sat is the second child who entered the first grade at Sambour Primary School in 2017 and dropped

out in 2018 due to nephropathy. His illness was in a better condition in 2019, but he did not return to school, but instead, he had to help his parents with farming.

On Saturday, February 15, 2020, I visited Phat Sat's family in Koh Samrong village. I went to talk to Phat Sat and found out that he was an out-of-school kid. I immediately comforted and persuaded him to return to school, but he said, "No, I'm busy going to work on the farm with my parents."

On Saturday, February 22, 2020, I went to Koh Samrong village again. We sat and talked about life, study, and other issues for almost an hour together. When I was ready to go home, I tried to persuade him to go back to school again, emphasizing the importance of education and promising to provide him with the study materials and encourage other children to do the same. Then, he also said that he would go and ask for permission from his parents to go back to school. If his parents agreed, he would go to see me at school on Monday, February 24, 2020.

Finally, his parents allowed that, and he came to see me at school. Then, I took him to see the school principal, and the principal let him get into grade 2. And Phat Sat told me he would try his best to keep up with his study.
